The role is a fly-in/fly-out position, working on a regular rotational schedule for the duration of the 2024 exploration program (June-October).

- Drill management including sighting drill pads, line-ups, monitoring daily production, ensuring the integrity of downhole surveys, and pre- and post drilling inspections.
